The Sissification of Christianity

Why is there so little of it in the American Church?

Pusillanimous means "Destitute of that strength and firmness of mind which constitute courage, bravery and fortitude; being of weak courage..."

Why is Christianity so pussified? (Sorry friends. That is not vulgar) Pussified means cowardly.

Courage is not synonymous with manhood. Women can also be courageous. But it is nearly impossible to be a REAL MAN and lack courage. My Christian friends, you are least like our Savior when you are cowardly. Bravery is not the absence of fear but rather the OVERCOMING of fear.
