## Why Are Americans Tolerating Injustice?

The price of freedom, in both the natural and in the spiritual, has been that of blood (1 Corinthians 2:14). First and foremost, the atonement of our souls was paid for through the blood and sacrifice of Christ that we might obtain spiritual liberty in Him (2 Corinthians 3:17).

"For the life of the flesh is in the blood, and I have given it to you upon the altar to make atonement for your souls; for it is the blood that makes atonement for the soul." -Leviticus 17:11; Hebrews 9:22
